All Beef Cattle Exhibitors will be required to pay a **\$ 15 per head bedding fee**. Tan bark will be provided in the **Voinovich Beef Barn only**, none will be provided for tie-outs. Animals entered in both Open and Junior Shows only need to pay a \$15 per head fee once.

SPECIAL RULE

Any product which changes, enhances or alters the natural color of an animal will not be permitted. (Including but not limited to - paint, dye, powder, non-clear adhesive and foam or shoe polish.)

ENTERING PROCEDURE

All entries close June 20. All entry information: breed of animal, division number, class number, name of animal, sire name, registry number, date of birth, tattoo number and sex of animal must be included on the entry form. Exhibitors will be permitted **one substitution**. Exhibitors should be prepared to fill out group entry cards upon arrival at the fair. **NO entry cards will be mailed.**

Breed association representatives, when available, will assist in checking cards and papers. Please inform the office of breed committee members. A program, for each breed, will be posted listing animals to be shown.

Animals will be stalled between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on check-in day. **Must** be in place by 12:00 noon day of check-in. Cattle **cannot arrive** before 7:00 p.m. day preceding check-in. Stall assignments will be given at 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. the evening preceding check-in, unless a Breed Representative is responsible for stall assignments. **Do not** stall in barn unless you have received stall assignments.

Premiums will not be paid unless registration number of breeding animals is furnished prior to show. Animals must have been transferred to or registered in the name of the exhibitor at time of checking papers prior to show.

Exhibitors may make as many entries in individual classes as they choose. Three animals may be shown in an individual class, but only two animals per class can win money, ribbons and placings.

Do not make entries in champion classes.

Any animal which is not entered in single classes will not be permitted to show in group classes. Animals owned in partnership may be shown by only one member of the partnership in group classes.

All animals, regardless of age, must be recorded and appear in the name of the exhibitor on the records of their respective associations.

Entries will not be accepted unless animals are registered.

All exhibitors must be prepared to show the original certificates of registration when called for. Copies will **not** be accepted. Failure forfeits right to show or award.

A multi-registered animal may only be shown as **ONE** breed in both the open and junior show.

No premiums will be awarded unless animal corresponds to description and ownership as shown by registration and transfer certificates.

Any breed failing to exhibit a 3-year average minimum of **40 animals** will be evaluated by management regarding continuation of the breed in future shows.

All exhibitors may be required to parade their cattle and to furnish cows for the judging contest, at the request of the Superintendent in charge.

HERDSMAN AWARD

Herdsmen Awards are offered in each beef breed, using the following score card:

- A. Cooperative effort.....35
 - 1. Willingness to cooperate with management in parades, showing, check-in, etc.
 - 2. Courtesy and willingness to follow regulations and be in barn at designated times.
 - 3. General courtesy to the public.
 - 4. Neat appearance.

- B. Animals.....25
 - 1. Animals tied for best presentation.
 - 2. Animals kept clean at all times.
 - 3. Plenty of bedding used.
 - 4. Animals fed and watered regularly.

- C. Barn.....40
 - 1. Aisles kept free and clean for spectators
 - 2. Exhibit cards neatly displayed.
 - 3. Equipment kept in show boxes.
 - 4. Feed kept in feed aisles.
 - 5. Stalls kept clean and dry.

BREED DISPLAYS

Breed associations may erect a breed exhibit display. However, no premium money will be paid for exhibits. The Beef Department Superintendent's Office will designate space for Breed Booth Displays.

PREMIER EXHIBITORS AWARD

This award to be made to the exhibitor winning the most money, cannot exceed ten animals shown and exhibited in the open single classes. (No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top ten animals winning the most money.) If a herd is registered in the names of the immediate members of a family (i.e. husband/wife, children or grandchildren) this herd will be considered as a single entry for the premier exhibitor award.

PREMIER BREEDERS AWARD

This award to be made to the breeder of not to exceed ten animals winning the most money in open single classes, including animals bred by him but exhibited by others. (No limit on number exhibited but award automatically figured on top ten animals winning the most money.)

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Boulevard, St. Joseph, Missouri will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire, or breeder six-head).

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. **Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted - only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association.** Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks, or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with calf at side, must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check-in.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting the exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on

any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Exhibitors making entries in individual classes must do so in the full membership name of the present owner or owners as it appears on the registration certificate.

Youngest class will be shown first, with animals being led in, in order of age, with the youngest to oldest with separate individual entry number for each animal.

There will be a cow calf class. No age limit on cows. Calves must be born after January 1, 2008. Calves may also be entered and shown in individual classes. All cows and calves will be shown in one class. Cow/Calf are not allow to show for Grand Champion Female.

SPECIAL RULES

The 2008 Ohio State Fair Chianina Show will be showing by the National Chianina Association Rules.

Chianina, Chiford, Chiamine, CAX 1CA, 2CA, PCA

1. Active adult and junior members of the ACA are eligible to show and/or receive premium monies provided by the ACA. Partial interest owners must be active members of the ACA. Membership may be obtained by writing to the ACA, P.O. Box 890, Platte City, MO 64079 or by phoning (816) 431-2808.

2. All cattle entered **MUST** be registered in the ACA Herdbook. Cattle will not be shown with an application for registration.

3. Original registration certificates **MUST** be presented to the superintendent at the show. Every animals' tattoo will be read and must agree with the registration certificate. Any animal not having a legible tattoo, or a tattoo not corresponding with its registration certificate will be barred from showing. **Animals entered in the Chianina can ONLY show in these classes.**

4. The surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited. This includes altering the conformation by typing up the dewlap or creating tucks by using adhesive on the dewlap, brisket, sheath, or navel. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.

In order to inspect animals to determine if the animals are polled, scurred, or horned, **NO** altering of the heads or removal of scurs from Chiangus cattle is permitted. If a Chiangus head has been altered in any way, that animal is not eligible to show in the Chiangus division. *All horned Chianina must be dehorned prior to being shown. *The use of false tail heads is prohibited. *The addition of hair or hemp or any similar substance to any part of an animal's body is prohibited. Dyeing or artificially changing the color of an animal is prohibited. Coloring agents, except powders, may be used on the legs and tail switches. No coloring agent may be used above the animal's flank. **NO** powder of any kind or color may be used on any part of an animal.

5. All bulls one year of age or older must have a permanent nose ring with a lead attached to the ring.

6. All cattle will be made available for a veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering and/or determination of horns or scurs. All cattle will be made available for a veterinary examination to be mouthed. Every exhibitor agrees to abide by the determination of the examining veterinarian(s).

7. By entering cattle in this show, the exhibitor agrees to abide by all show rules. Although these decisions are sometimes subjective, they are made by the most competent, knowledgeable people available and their decisions will be final.

SHOW RULES

1. All Animals must be registered with the American Gelbvieh Association. Only the original registration certificate or performance pedigree or performance summary will be accepted as proof of registration. **NO PHOTOCOPIES OR FAX** copies will be accepted.
2. The owner name on the AGA registration certificate must be the same as the owner name on the entry form or the entry will be disqualified.
3. All females must be 50% Gelbvieh or greater; all bulls must be 75% Gelbvieh or greater. Percentage and purebred cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
4. All animals must be tattooed. Tattoos must be legible and properly match the animal's registration certificate.
5. All bulls over one year of age must show with a nose lead.
6. The Gelbvieh show superintendant reserves the right to disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable.
7. No limitations are placed on the color or color pattern of any Gelbvieh entered in the show.
8. The show management reserves the right to split classes larger than ten head.

9. All animals shown in group classes must have shown in individual classes.

10. All bulls will be weighed and **WEIGHT PER DAY OF AGE** recorded on exhibitors card.

11. The cow/calf champion shall be eligible for overall champion female.

12. No unethical fitting will be tolerated. No paint or other color above the hocks, no lifting or filling under the skin, no artificial tailheads or unnatural building of legs. The OVGA reserves the right to take blood samples and mouth all cattle.

13. Heifers born twin to a bull are eligible to show without a registration certificate if accompanied by a copy of the signed veterinary examination report deeming her to be fertile.

14. Best Four Head— Four animals, either sex, any age, owned and exhibited by one exhibitor.

15. Get of Sire— Three head, any age, either sex, sired by same sire. May be owned by more than one exhibitor.

16. Produce of Dam— Two head, any age, either sex, out of same dam.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Heifers 24 months of age or older to be eligible must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
2. A cow shown with calf at side: Calf must be her natural calf meeting the standard of excellence.
3. All Senior Bull Classes (Late Junior Yearling Bull and over) must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
4. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo, numerical fire brand, or freeze brand.
5. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be recorded in the name of the junior member. This recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animals entered.
6. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. **Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums awards and points won by same exhibitors.**
7. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age.
8. Entries in each class will be placed 1,2,3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
9. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
10. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals to be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue. Animals will be inspected by Field Service Representative (if present) assisted by one member of Shows and Exhibits Committee or Breed Standards Committee if needed to settle disputes. If no Field Service Representative is present, it will be done by committee members not involved in that class.
11. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
12. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle, or a minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
13. In all shows in which fifty (50) head or less entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.

14. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.

15. The judge **must** be an SGBI approved judge.

16. Each exhibitor must be a member in good standing with SGBI.

17. Dress for showing in an approved SGBI show shall be of clean and neat clothing, hats or bareheaded with no caps. This is for both Open and Junior shows. **No** tennis shoes.

18. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation, feed and care, to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules.

19. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change for cosmetic purposes, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Silicon injection or other injections for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited

20. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.

21. **ETHICS:** The showing of unethically fitted livestock or livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered is prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any method altering the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body. Animals showing signs of having been operated upon or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults in conformation or with intent to deceive relative to the animal's soundness, will be disqualified. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse against SGBI and designated personnel. Any

false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.

22. Any exhibitor whether it be the owner or custom fitter or anyone else who has the custody of the animal being shown in any SGBI approved show who shows an animal which has had as an anabolic steroid administration to it either by injection or diuretic or any other administration, shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. The animal shall be barred from ever showing in a SGBI approved show again.

23. No pumping or filling an animal with liquid, air or any other substance is allowed. Violations will result in disqualification and banning from all shows of that exhibitor and/or owner.

24. Any exhibitor who knowingly shows an animal in a SGBI approved show who is in violation of the rule herein above set forth relating to showing an animal in its natural conformation and structure as defined herein above may be suspended by the Board of Directors for six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense.

25. Any person who furnished the birthday of the animal to SGBI either on the IPRA of some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in a SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.

26. At all National Open Shows and at any other show determined by the Executive Committee of the Board of Director of SGBI, all animals shall be weighed and their weight per day of age made known to the judge and show officials. It shall be accomplished by the show officials and/or representatives of SGBI.

27. SGBI and its representative have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification and pedigree of exhibited animals. "Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all shows rules as adopted by SGBI"

28. Each exhibitor shall submit his registered Santa Gertrudis cattle to such tests and examinations as may be requested and/or required by the SGBI, its authorized representatives, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair.

29. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgement past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.

30. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam or show rule enforcement, as applied to his animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.

31. **APPEALS:** An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or designated association representation designated by the SGBI under sections 1 and 4 of the Inspection of Exhibits may be made to the Executive Committee of SGBI if the following requirements are satisfied: (1) the appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party, and (2) the appealing party files the written appeal with SGBI Board of Directors or SGBI Representative or fair officials as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated association representatives' decision is rendered and in any event within six (6) hours of the time of the veterinarian's or designated association representatives' decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements is filled with the SGBI Board of Directors, the Board of Directors shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party and the Veterinarian or designated association representatives whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that is relevant to the matter, following which the Board of Directors shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

32. **PROCEDURES TO FILE PROTEST:**

1. File protest with show that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.

2. File the same protest with the Shows and Exhibits Committee. Contact the chairman.

3. Three exhibitors must sign the protest.

4. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the

Shows and Exhibits Committee within twenty four hours after the occasion for such protests.

5. Order of hearing a protest:
 - A. Chairman of Shows and Exhibits Committee
 - B. Action by Shows and Exhibits Committee
 - C. Final action by Board of Directors
 - D. Follow appeal procedure as outlined in Rules and Regulations

6. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the Shows and Exhibits Committee shall be subject to the following penalties:

- A. Loss of Premium Money
- B. Loss of Awards
- C. Suspension from showing that animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one show, two or three or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
- D. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other SGBI Rules penalties.

33. Failure to adhere to each shows specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.

34. **DISQUALIFICATIONS:** An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him maybe moved up (at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee) to fill the vacated position.

No exhibitor will be paid more than two premiums in an individual class, and the Association does not pay additional premiums in the championship classes. The ASA's share of premiums will be paid and handled directly from their office in Omaha, Nebraska.”

In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to receive the American Shorthorn Association's (ASA) share of the premiums at ASA supported **Shows**, the owner's entire herd must be enrolled in the Shorthorn Performance Records (SPR) Program and each animal shown must have individual SPR Records.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.

All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Shorthorn Association by the time of the Fair or Show.

Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.

Family bred and raised animals entered by Juniors in Junior classes and subsequently entered in Open Classes may be treated as family entries in group classes.

All shows held after October 1, of the show year must have Late and Early Spring Calf Championships added to the Division Champions, and seven Champions will be available for consideration for Grand Champion Awards. Contact Julie Duis for division specifications if your show date fall after October 1, 2008.

All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the Association. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the American Shorthorn Association and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final. Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.

Simmental Influence Division

NOTE - beginning in 2008 3/4 females will be moved to the Simmental Influence Division.

1. The Simmental Influence Division is for females born between September 1, 2006 to May 31, 2008 and bulls born between January 1, 2006 to May 31, 2008. To show in the Simmental Influence Division, all cattle must be a minimum of 50% (1/2 blood) and less than 7/8 Simmental. Bulls must be a minimum of 50% and no more than 7/8 Simmental.

2. Any animal not having legible, permanent identification (tattoo) will be ineligible to show. Also, at check-in the tattoos must properly match the registration certificates (both numerically and in identified ear.) Fresh tattoos made before check-in are acceptable, but animals that do not have legible and correctly matching tattoo during processing will not be permitted to be tattooed and re-checked in. An animal at check-in which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding exactly to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be tattooed and re-checked at the show.

3. Exhibitors must have the **ORIGINAL REGISTRATION PAPERS** issued by the American Simmental Association, **no** carbon or photocopy, available at the time of check-in. We will **NOT** accept any fax copies of registration paper.

4. Cattle born in 2008 must have a Registration Certificate to be shown.

5. A heifer calf born twin to a bull is eligible to show without a registration certificate if the heifer is accompanied by a certificate from a licensed veterinarian stating she has been examined and found to be fertile.

6. The owner's name on the ASA Registration Certificate must be the same, as on the exhibitor entry form or the entry will be disqualified. The only exception is for JR ASA/OA members showing under their farm names.

7. Any entry is subject to mousing and blood testing. Additionally, Ohio State and Ohio Department of Agriculture grooming rules apply.

8. Simmental Influence Bulls over 12 months of age must show with a nose lead or ring.

9. All bulls 15 months of age and older must have a current semen test/breeding soundness exam and show to be a satisfactory breeder. The test must have been done within sixty days prior to the show date.

10. Registration must be presented at check-in or entries will be disqualified. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

11. Simmental Influence cattle will be exhibited at the conclusion of the purebred group classes. Simmental Influenced cattle are **NOT** eligible to show in the group classes in the purebred division nor will their placings be considered for the overall Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor awards.

12. Fitting - Open Livestock General Rules and Regulations applies to all exhibitors.

If this agrees with the payment per animal fee, then no other inform

Reminder: The Junior entry blank is a different one than the Open. If you want to enter both Junior and Open, then two blanks are needed.

Entry due date of June 20, 2008 means the entry blank and money must be postmarked, not received by this date. **REMINDER:** metered mail is not acceptable.

Late entry(June 21-July 26) requires a \$50.00 late fee per exhibitor, per species, plus the usual per animal charge. If wanting to enter both Junior and Open, then it would be \$50.00 for each area, plus the animal entry fee. An entry may be made (July 27-Aug. 10) at the rate of \$75.00 per exhibitor, per species and per animal charge. Checks should be made payable to: Ohio State Fair. It's permissible to pay for multiple family members with only one check, provided all entries are sent in the same envelope.
