Peoples Choice Announced: August 5, 2008 – Winner will receive a rosette.

Division Notes:

- Quilts and wall hangings will be displayed at the risk of the owner; however, hired staff will be in attendance to help monitor exhibits, and every effort will be made to protect exhibits.
- Certified national quilting judges will judge quilts pre-Fair.
- Judges will utilize a comment sheet to be returned with each quilt/wall hanging entry (except Collectible Quilts). This form is designed to help the Judges provide skill improvement assessments for exhibitors.
- Refer to General Rules for insurance information.

- If exhibitor name is sewn into the entry, it must be covered for judging.
- Entry tag must be attached (with a small safety pin and 7" long piece of lightweight string/cord) to the bottom right hand corner of the quilt/wall hanging.
- Entries in classes #1-5 & #18-19 must measure a minimum of 72" on the shortest side. Entries over 90" must have a sleeve at that length for display. Undersized entries will be disqualified and will not be displayed.
- Best of Show winners will receive a Mountain Mist brand batting.
- Entries in classes 1-16 must be the work of the exhibitor/group and made within the past three years.
- Entries in classes 9-12 must have a suitable dowel rod or lath strip for hanging.
- Entries in classes 1-8 must have a sleeve attached securely to the top edge of the quilt to facilitate its hanging on a metal rod.
- Quilts and wall hangings must be quilted (tufted or tied will not be accepted).
- Machine technique quilts must be stitched and quilted by the exhibitor and not commercially finished (except group/team projects).
- The sleeve may be of muslin or any fabric sewn or safety pinned to the back of the quilt (much like a rod heading on a curtain – absolutely no straight pins).
- The sleeve must have a 4" wide opening to accommodate the metal rod and should be as long as the quilt width to allow the quilt to hang smoothly.
- Quilts with scalloped or irregular edge should have the sleeve positioned (by the exhibitor) in such a way as to have the entire face of the quilt displayed.
- Miniature quilt entries should have their own miniature dowel rod for display.
- Wall hangings must have a sleeve or means for display hanging. Large pieces will need a 4" sleeve; smaller pieces may have dowel or heading for a smaller hanging device.
- Quilted clothing and other quilted items must be predominately quilted. A small amount of tufts or ties may be present.
- Group/team quilt projects (classes #15-16), must be made by two or more people (i.e. club project, family members, neighbors, etc.).
- Collectible quilts are not required to be the work of the entrant. The quilt could have been purchased, inherited, or be a family heirloom. They must be in good condition and clean.
- Entries for class 5 – first time an exhibitor has entered a quilt.
