- The Ohio State Fair (OSF) Junior Division provides opportunities for Camp Fire Youth of Ohio to demonstrate their talents and skills.
- It is the desire of OSF staff and judges for Camp Fire USA Youth of Ohio to have a positive experience through their involvement at the OSF. If you have questions, please contact one of the leaders listed above.
- Entering
 - *Entering*
 - Mailed entries must be prepaid and addressed to
 Ohio Expo Center

 717 E. 17th Avenue, Columbus, OH 43211-2698
 - *How To Enter*
 - Entry is open to currently registered Camp Fire Youth.
 - Include the exhibitor's address (even if entry tags are to be mailed to the leader) on the entry form.
 - Individual projects may be entered only in the level corresponding to the school grade that the individual has just completed.
 - Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, or will be disqualified.
 - Clubs entering must submit a separate entry form.
 - *Entry Rules*

- Articles that has been entered in a previous Ohio State Fair Junior Division exhibit may not be entered again (except ceremonial costumes, equipment, and individual collections). However, these items (except 2006 grand award winners) may be entered each year if changes have been made from the previous judging. Changes must be included in the explanation.
- Graded school projects may be entered (with name, grade, and teacher's comments removed or covered).
- Club entries must use official club name and not the leader's name (i.e. "Happy Campers" rather than 2nd grade Starflight; "Wataka Adventure Club" rather than 4th grade Adventurers). Add the number of members within the group to tag.
- An authorized adult and leader must sign entry forms.
- Work must be checked to assure exhibits are in accordance with the rules.
- Tags must be completely filled out and firmly attached to the exhibit before delivery.
- The entry tag must have the exhibitor's age.
- Exhibitor's name, class number, exhibitor number, and description of article must be written on the property claim check stub of the entry tag. This property check stub must be presented at checkout to remove your exhibits.
- Information that may be helpful to the judge should be written on an appropriate size index card, and securely attached to the entry tag (exceptions will be made for ceremonial equipment – refer to Entry Rules).
- Exhibits must adhere to a size limitation of 3' x 3' (1,296 square inches); weigh no more than 20 pounds; and be sturdily constructed (exceptions must be approved by one of the leaders (listed above) before July 1, 2007 and written approval must be attached to the exhibit).
- Artwork, wall hangings, and photographs must be matted or framed and ready to hang. Wires and cords must be securely attached (taped on cords/wire and paste on hangers are not permitted).
- Ribbon winners will be displayed (all others will be displayed as space allows).
- Entries mailed to the Fair can be returned C.O.D.; however, Fair management and Camp Fire cannot be held responsible.
- JUDGING – Judges will be chosen from as many councils (represented at the Fair) as possible.
- Hand built ceramics must be made by hand (no molds).
- Molded ceramics must have a matt finish (fired once only, then painted and sealed with a spray)
- Glazed Finish are cleaned and can have an under-glazing (fired, glazed and fired again - glazed is always fired twice)and with finished bottoms.
- One photograph – b/w or color (any size) and mounted (if mounted, no larger than 11"x 14").
- Closing Day
 - The "release ticket" can be picked up at check-in.
 - Exhibitor wanting/need to bring their vehicle on grounds after 9:00pm will need to see staff prior to 6:00pm – no exceptions.
- **Baked Goods and Food (items with uncooked eggs are not permitted)**
 - **Pre-School Starflight/Adventure**
 - Youth need to wear Camp Fire uniform or colors.
 - Whole items need not be entered (six cookies or pieces of candy; _ cake or pie).
 - Use disposable container for baked goods.
 - The recipe with exact ingredients and directions must be attached to the entry tag (no commercial mixes; with exception to creativity with a commercial mix).
 - "Creativity with a commercial mix" means using creative ingredients instead of using a creative design. It is the addition of ingredients to a store bought mix that judging will be based on.
 - **Discovery/Horizon**
 - Plan to arrive _ hour early (Baked Goods only).
 - Each exhibitor must accompany his/her exhibit.
 - Whole items such as a loaf of bread, cake or pie should be entered.
 - Party sandwiches, snack tray, box of candy, etc., will be judged on the overall arrangement and/or taste.
 - Decorated cakes must be edible (may be made from scratch or commercial mix) and will be judged on overall originality and design (no novelty pans or kits).
 - The recipe with exact ingredients and directions must be attached to the entry tag (no commercial mixes; with exception of decorating cake and creativity with a commercial mix).

- “Creativity with a commercial mix” means using creative ingredients instead of using a creative design. It is the addition of ingredients to a store bought mix that judging will be based on.
- **Style Show (Adventure, Discovery, and Horizon)**
 - Exhibitors must appear for judging with entries (in the Rhodes Center, Rm. 126) on August 5, 2007 at 10am and must remain for judging and style show rehearsal (judging is closed to the public).
 - Clothing entered in any other classification of the Fair may not be entered in the Style Show.
 - Please notify the superintendent before July 28, 2007 if an entry is to be withdrawn from the Style Show.
 - Sewing for others requires the model and exhibitor to participate in both judging and style show.
 - The Fun With Clothes categories are not eligible for Best of Show; however, points will be counted for grand awards.
 - Fun with Clothes For Others requires the model and exhibitor to participate in both judging and style show.
 - Best of Show items will be put on display for the remainder of the Fair.
- **Grand Awards**
 - Grand Awards will be posted, as winners are determined.
 - Grand Awards will be given to those individuals and clubs who have received a first place award. The award will be presented to the club or individual who has the most total points.
 - Grand Award winners will be notified by mail.
 - Grand Awards are listed in section J-1306.
- **Best of Show**
 - Rosettes will be awarded for an individual entry in each level (Starflight, Adventure, Discovery Club, and Horizon Club), as shown in section J-1306.
- **Hosting**
 - Camp Fire youth (Adventure level and older) act as host in the exhibit area during the Fair. If you would like to host, please contact one of the leaders listed above or your council Fair chairperson.
 - Host schedules are set in two (2) hours time slots with four (4) tickets per time slot allowed. All adult and youth host in the Camp Fire exhibit should stay and be in the parade at 4:00 p.m. Please wear Camp Fire colors.
- **Pre-Fair Staff**
 - Applications are due May 14, 2007. To obtain an application, contact your Department Superintendent or your council Fair chairperson.
- **Ticket Information**
 - Youth participating in the style show, as a host, and the Discovery/Horizon baked goods food show, must pick up their tickets for entry to the Fair at the time of delivery of entries on July 28, 2007. If you cannot pick up tickets at that time, it is your responsibility to contact the department superintendent, or one of the assistant superintendents to obtain tickets.
- **Equipment - Ceremonial**
 - Names must not be visible on the explanation (explanation may be on card, notebook paper, etc.).
 - Headbands and Ceremonial Equipment must be accompanied by an explanation of symbolism or any other information that will be helpful to the judge.
 - Ceremonial costumes and attire must be accompanied by an explanation of garment design, accessories, any symbolism used, and description of patches, what they mean, and how earned (patches must be sewn or ironed on - no tape or pins; beads must be sewn to garment - no pins).
 - Ceremonial items (except 2006 Best of Show winners, who must sit out one year) may be entered each year if there have been changes made from the previous judging. Changes must be included in the explanation.

- Ribbons may be awarded first through third place.
- Club projects may be entered in the division in which they have been currently registered for the past school year and must be the project(s) of the club working as a unit.
- The exhibit may be one large item that the majority of club members have worked or 2-4 samples of individual items made by the club as a club project.
- Community family clubs & mega clubs projects include multiple program levels enrolled in the same club.
